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#7 Rhetorical Analysis: The Interesting Narrative of Olaudah Equiano

ASSIGNMENT: You have been asked to consider how <u>identity</u>, <u>role</u>, <u>and subjectivity</u> interact to shape Equiano's speaking "I" in a particular passage of his *Narrative*. To do this, you will be reading closely for keywords indicating <u>Ethos</u>, <u>Logos</u>, <u>Pathos</u>, and conventions of speaking to an audience in Equiano's particular time and place. Use this page to help yourself make a claim about the speaking self in your passage. Before you begin, review notes from Prof. Mailloux's lectures, re-read the passage, and check <u>Handbook</u> pages on identity, role, and subjectivity (137-138).

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METHOD: Ethos: 1]Re-read the passage underlining or highlighting keywords which suggest ways in which Equiano seems to be taking on a **social role** or function (Missionary? Orator?). Circle keywords or terms that seem to be defining his sense of **identity**, as interpreted being in relation to self or others. Underline twice any keywords that seem to indicate Equiano's sense of **subjectivity**, a consciousness of himself as someone who is the product of material or social experiences in a particular time or place. 2] Now work on *Logos:* which keywords make logical connections that help reinforce the structure of Equiano's speaking "I"? 3] Pathos: Which words seem designed to have emotional impact on the audience? Tip: What did you learn from your Discovery Task scholar? Consider using separate sheets for E-L-P.
